It's God's Agenda, Not Mine.

Most afternoons at Perry Correctional, we go into lock-up for a couple of hours. This particular afternoon my destination was C dorm, planning on talking to a friend and encouraging him in his walk with Jesus. As I walked inside, an officer met me in the hall and told me it was not a good time to be there for unknown reasons and to come back later. Disappointed, I turned around and left trying to decide my next agenda.

There are four lock-up units at Perry and I had some birthday cards that needed to be delivered to an inmate who I thought was in B dorm. No problems while checking into B dorm, I walked to the cell and the inmate was no longer there and had been released to the yard. I'm standing there thinking "strike two." As I turned around to leave there was a guy standing at his door looking across the hall with the saddest, most hopeless eyes. As I started a conversation with him, I found out he was at the bottom. His family had turned against him and he had tried to take his own life. I shared with him how God has used different circumstances to bring me to his door that day and how he loves him so much. With tears in his eyes, Marion gave his life to Jesus and God gave him a love for His Word. When I checked in with Marion a week later, he was so excited because for the first time the Bible made perfect sense to him and he could not get enough of God's love letter to him.

Coincidence? No Way. I didn't just happen to come to his door that day. It was God's perfect agenda. The next time your plans don't work out; get excited, God may have you on a mission.

Thank you for your partnership in this ministry and your part in making it possible for these men and women to have people mentor and encourage them to live a different life.
